NEW SENECA CREEK ACCESS OPENS

The new \$3 million dollar facility is located at 280 Seneca Creek Rd near Clemson University. It has a three-lane boat ramp with two courtesy docks along with a fishing dock, a separate kayak launch dock, rest rooms and picnic area. The area can accommodate up to 49 cars with trailers and 30 additional car parking spaces. It has 24-hour video monitoring and is patrolled to provide an extremely safe environment. The Oconee County Parks and Recreation Department provides the maintenance and management of the new facility.

LHA Supports Lake Hartwell Partners for Clean Water on Splash Away Trash Event

On Saturday April 22 over 250 people helped in cleaning up the shoreline and islands of Lake Hartwell. The event was staged from 7 different landings and state parks around the lake. People pitched in and picked up trash and all kinds of abandoned items like metal chairs, tires, and camping debris. Many students from area schools and colleges participated along with families and community groups. Dock Electrical Safety! It could mean a life saved...

Incorrectly installed or faulty AC wiring can be fatal. Recently an Anderson County resident and prominent doctor lost his life due to poor dock wiring. The Corps of Engineers requires a detailed layout of dock wiring prior to installation and in the 2020 Shoreline Management Plan (available on our website) the requirements of how the power pole on federal property should be installed. Every five years prior to renewing your dock permit you will have to have a state licensed electrician inspect and certify your electrical installation to submit to the Corps. Solar power is exempt from this requirement because low DC power is not a threat. This is a good reason to consider solar power as an option.

To ensure there is no stray electrical current present in the water surrounding your doc and prevent a major cause of electrical shock and drowning is to install an equipment leakage circuit interrupter (ELCI). Just like the ground fault circuit interrupters (GFCI) outlets in your boat galley or home kitchen, this device detects any current that is leaking into the water. Like a residential GFCI, it instantly trips the circuit breaker if a problem is detected to stop all electrical flow. DockLifeguard and ShockIQ are two devices that licensed electricians can install for your protection.

Zoning, or Lack around Lake!

Presumably most of us moved to this area—and many adjacent to the lake—because we liked what we saw. We liked the relative busy-ness of the area (or lack of). We liked the beauty, not just of the lake, but of the land and land use surrounding and approaching the lake. We liked the empty spaces and the neighboring farmlands. Over time, others have recognized the same, but are trying to exploit those items for personal gain. You can't avoid noticing it—the randomness of new RV parks, short term rentals, storage places, etc. that are popping up everywhere. And there is nothing wrong with these. But many people would like some control over new businesses and uses of land around their area. It can affect traffic, safety, beauty, the environment, property values, and general welfare of yourself and your neighbors.

It may seem there is little to do to manage these proposed new entities other than stand around and watch things happen around us and wonder 'why was that allowed'? Or 'that seems pretty out of synch with the neighbors or the neighboring properties'. Or, 'I wish that wasn't in my area, that is not what I expected when I moved here'.

Lake Hartwell, and the surrounding towns, communities, and counties, is one of the hottest demand areas in the country. What can be done to better manage the growth generated by all the things that drew us to this area and are now drawing many more? What can be done to manage the 'pressure' put on Lake Hartwell by everything being put up around the lake? You can't stop it....but can it be managed better to allow new businesses, etc. and yet preserve many of the reasons people moved here from the start?

ZONING is the next step towards taking some control over what could be brought to your area, and/or keeping what is currently there, in its existing use. Zoning allows residents a say in what they would like their neighborhood to be regarding land use. Zoning puts some legal 'teeth' into what otherwise seems to be a random, sometimes unstructured, process of approving how a particular property or piece of land is used. I've seen land sales advertisements that state something like—-'unzoned, do what you want'...... Is this what you want for your area as we continue to be pressured by growth? Consider zoning. That is the next step.

The laws to implement zoning vary from county-to-county. Anderson County zoning is initiated by voting precinct. Oconee County zoning is initiated by parcel or group of parcels, minimum 200 acres total. On the South Carolina side of Lake Hartwell, zoning is initiated by citizen action. I expect this citizen-driven process is similar for other lake-adjacent counties. Don't count on your county to do this. Take the initiative yourself.

Contrary to what is commonly heard...zoning is NOT government telling you what you can do with your land. It's actually the opposite of that....it's a process of letting government enforce what you the voters have voted you want in place in your area regarding future land use. In the absence of voting there is....nothing..... other than watching things evolve around you without any logic or control of the decision being made. The attached pictures are examples of what could have possibly been prevented if zoning were in place.



Boater Education Bill is New SC Law

The Boater Education Bill championed by two families that lost children through boating accidents is now law. Many organizations, including LHA, assisted in lobbying for the new requirement. The Law requires anyone born after July 1, 2007, to obtain a boaters education card by taking a boating safety course administered or approved by SCDNR before operating a boat with a 15HP motor or a PWC (jet ski). Courses are offered by DNR in person and online. In addition, courses are also taught by the US Coast Guard Auxiliary, The United States Power Squadron. Anyone renting a boat in the state must also take a safety course before operating a boat or PWC.

Georgia has required anyone born after 1998 operating a boat with a motor to take a boater safety course. We hoped SC would adopt this policy but baby steps first for our legislators.
